GUJARAT PROFESSIONAL TECHNICAL EDUCATIONAL COLLEGES OR INSTITUTIONS (REGULATION OF ADMISSION AND FIXATION OF FEES) ACT, 2007.

NO.GH/SH/06/2009/PVS-102008-631- S:-In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 20 read with section 4 of the Gujarat Professional Technical Educational Colleges or Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fixation of Fees) Act, 2007 (Guj. 2 of 2008), the Government of Gujarat hereby makes the following rules to regulate admission to the first year of Engineering and pharmacy course further to amend, the Gujarat Professional Technical Educational Colleges or Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Payment of Fees) Rules, 2008, namely:-

1. *Short Title and Commencement.*- (1) These rules may be called the Gujarat Professional Technical Educational Colleges or Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Payment of Fees) (Amendment) Rules, 2009.

2. In the Gujarat Professional Technical Educational Colleges or Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Payment of Fees) Rules, 2008 (hereinafter referred to as "the said rules"), in rule 5,-

(1) For sub-rule (1), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:-

"(1) For the purpose of admission, a candidate shall have passed the qualifying examination from,-

(i) the Gujarat Board; or

(ii) the Central Board of Secondary Education Board provided that,-

(a) the school in which the candidate has studied, should have been located in the State of Gujarat; or

- (b) the school in which the candidate has studied, should have been located in the Union Territories of Diu, Daman and Dadra Nagar Haveli and whose parents are origin of Gujarat, or
- (ii) the Council of Indian School Certificate Examination, New Delhi provided that,-
- (a) the school in which the candidate has studied, should have been located in the State of Gujarat; or
- (b) the school in which the candidate has studied, should have been located in the Union Territories of Diu, Daman and Dadra Nagar Haveli and whose parents are origin of Gujarat, and
- (iv) have appeared in the Gujarat Common Entrance Test conducted in the current academic year,-
In case of,-
- (a) a degree in engineering or technology course, passed with "A-group" or "AB-group";
- (b) a degree or diploma in pharmacy course, passed with "B-group" or "AB-group".
- (2) Sub-rule (8) shall be deleted.

3. In the said rules, in rule 10, after sub-rule (2), the following sub-rule shall be added, namely:-

- (3) (a) Notwithstanding any thing contained in sub-rule (2), one supernumerary seat in each college or institute shall be filled in, by the candidate who are migrants of the State of Jammu and Kashmir, in accordance with the directions from the All India Council of Technical Education, New Delhi and Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, subject to the eligibility criteria prescribed in these rules:
- (b) Such candidate shall be exempted from appearing in the Gujarat Common Entrance Test."

4. In the said rules, in rule 11,-

(1) for sub-rule (1), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:-

"(1) (a) The candidates who have passed qualifying examination, sixty percentage of marks obtained in theory of the subjects in the respective group after converting it to 100 combined with the forty percentage of marks obtained in the subjects of the same group in the Gujarat Common Entrance Test (GUJCET), after converting it to 100 from the total marks obtained, shall be the merit marks.

Explanation: For the purpose of calculation of merit marks,-

(a) The marks obtained in the theory subjects of the respective group in the qualifying examination shall be converted to 100 marks and the sixty percent of such converted marks (i.e. $\left\{ \frac{X}{Y} \times 100 \right\} (0.6)$, where the X is the marks obtained and Y is the total marks (maximum marks) in the qualifying examination).

(b) The marks obtained in relevant subjects of the Gujarat Common Entrance Test shall be converted to 100 marks and the forty percent of such converted marks (i.e. $\left\{ \frac{A}{B} \times 100 \right\} (0.4)$, where the A is the marks obtained and B is the total marks (maximum marks) in the Gujarat Common Entrance Test).

(c) The total of the (a) and (b) shall be the merit marks."

(2) for sub-rule (2), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:-

"(2) The admission committee shall prepare and publish separate merit lists, namely:-

- (a) The first merit list shall include the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from the Gujarat Board. Merit list of reserved category candidates shall be prepared separately;
- (b) The second merit list shall consist of two separate merit list, namely:-
- (i) the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from the Central Board of Secondary Education, and
 - (ii) the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from the Council of Indian School Certificate Examinations, New Delhi,
 - (iii) the available Seats shall be distributed on pro-rata basis taking into considerations the number of students passed from the Central Board of Secondary Education and Council of Indian School Certificate Examinations, New Delhi, in the current academic year.
 - (iv) (iv) Merit list of reserved category candidates shall be prepared separately.”.

5. In the said rules, in rule 15, the *Explanation* shall be substituted by the following, namely:--

“*Explanation.*- For the purpose of calculation of merit marks the Additional marks shall be added in total of marks obtained in the theory subjects in the Qualifying examination. ”.
